### VILLAGE OF HEUVELTON Regular Board Meeting October 16, 2019

At 6:00pm, Mayor Lashua called the meeting to order. Mayor Lashua opened the meeting with the pledge of allegiance. Trustees in attendance were E. Wood and A. Guardino. Trustees C. Basford and W. Knowlton were absent. Also in attendance were T. Murray, DPW Superintendent; Scott McConnell, DANC and C. Prior, EDR. T. Haynes, DANC arrived at 6:18pm.

**<u>HVFD Report</u>** There were no bids for the Barber tanker trailer. Since this was the third round of bidding with no acceptable offers, the Mayor stated that Chief Wood would like to sell it outright and the Board agreed.

#### **RESOLUTION 19-081**

#### BARBER TANKER TRAILER SALE

Offered by Tr. Guardino, seconded by Tr. Wood and Mayor Lashua - Aye. **Resolution to authorize the HVFD to sell the Barber tanker trailer outright.** 

**<u>Public Forum</u>** There were no members of the public present.

**Sewer/Water** Mr. McConnell stated he is getting the WWTP ready for winter. The manhole inspections are in progress. The sludge and soil samples have been submitted to C2ae. They will land apply when they receive approval from the DEC. Mr. McConnell left at 6:07pm. Mr. Prior advised the Board the USDA had requested additional information/clarification regarding the Preliminary Engineering Report for the Sewer Consolidation Project. He said the response will go out this week. He discussed some updates on financing for the project. He reviewed the Archeological Phase 1B Survey agreement and discussed when they should proceed with the survey.

#### RESOLUTION 19-082 WWTP CONSOLIDATION ARCHEOLOGICAL STUDY PHASE 1B

Offered by Mayor Lashua, seconded by Tr. Guardino. Tr. Wood - Aye.

**Resolution to hire EDR to proceed with the Archeological Study Phase 1B required for the NYS Route 812 Sewer Corridor Consolidation Project at a cost not to exceed \$19,500.00.** 

The DEC requested an Electrical Integrity Test for the lagoon as part of the consent order. Mr. Prior received quotes from 2 companies for preliminary testing. The lower priced quote was \$2,200.00, which the Board approved. Mr. Prior left at 6:30pm.

The Mayor updated the Board on the Water Tower Project. To date, the remains of three individuals have been found. Archeologists are currently in the process of recovering them. They are changing the route of the pipes to avoid disturbing further graves. There will be additional engineering and archeological costs associated with this. Fiacco Construction should be done with the base by the end of October. The pedestal and tank will be done in the spring. C2ae is going to proceed with putting the water distribution portion of the project out for bid as soon as possible.

Mayor Lashua discussed the Equalization Tank Project. The problem with the floor seems to be resolved. Sherwin Williams is extending the warranty from one year to five years.

WHEREAS, additional construction phase engineering services and sub-consultant archeological services for the administration, coordination and implementation of the August 2018 State Historic Preservation Office/NYS Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation Human Remains Discovery Protocol, as a result of the human remains discovered on the water tower construction site on September 23, 2019.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Village of Heuvelton shall pay C2ae an additional or modified compensation not to exceed \$25,000.00.

<u>Mayors Report</u> Thomas Haynes updated the Board on the 100 State Street Project. He reviewed the change orders for Atlantic Testing Laboratories. He is continuing to work on the SAM grant and RVRDA funding. The paperwork for the DANC grant/loan is ready for submission. He reviewed the pay application and budget for the project. Mr. Haynes left at 6:50pm
